## Pawan Expresses Anguish Over Shabad Incident



### Deputy CM writes to Revanth Pawan calls for strict measures in POCSO implementation

Amaravati, July 15: Andhra Pradesh Deputy Chief Minister Pawan Kalyan expressed deep shock over the mass killing incident in Shabad, Telangana. In a letter addressed to Telangana Chief Minister Revanth Reddy on Wednesday, he urged the government to take stringent measures to ensure the effective implementation of the POCSO Act and to provide complete security to victims. Referring to the horrific incident in Shabad, Pawan Kalyan described the tragedy—in which the accused in a POCSO case (Rajkumar) murdered a 16-year-old girl, her mother, and her grandmother, before killing his own wife and two children and subsequently committing suicide—as deeply distressing. He opined that such incidents expose systemic flaws and highlighted the need to strengthen the mechanism for providing timely protection to victims. In his letter, Pawan suggested taking measures to ensure that investigations into POCSO cases are completed within a stipulated timeframe. He called for strengthening the system for preserving evidence intact and urged the implementation of protective measures to ensure the safety of victims and their families. Pawan noted that the accused had obtained anticipatory bail in the case, while there was a simultaneous failure to provide adequate security to the victims' families.

## Special Review on Dharmavaram Drinking Water Issues



### Harish Babu issues key directives to officials following instructions from Minister Satya Kumar Yadav

### Order to accelerate construction of overhead water tanks worth ₹29 crore

### - Instruction to make new motors operational within a week

Dharmavaram, July 15: To permanently resolve the drinking water issues in Dharmavaram town, Harish Babu—the constituency in-charge representing State Minister for Health, Medical, Family Welfare, and Medical Education (and Dharmavaram MLA) Satya Kumar Yadav—held a special review meeting with municipal officials at the NDA office on Wednesday. Municipal Executive Engineer Sai Krishna, Deputy Engi-

neer Veeresh, and Water Works staff participated in the meeting. Harish Babu reviewed the obstacles hindering drinking water supply in various parts of the town and ordered immediate action to ensure residents face no inconvenience. Officials explained that power outages, motor malfunctions, and pipeline maintenance issues were the primary causes of supply disruptions; Harish Babu advised them to improve coordination between the relevant departments and implement permanent solutions. He also specifically reviewed the construction status of two overhead water tanks—sanctioned in 2014 under the AMRUT scheme at a cost of approximately ₹29 crore—which had previously stalled. It was noted that water supply is being affected because the construction of water tanks in the 22nd Ward (Sai Nagar)

and the 28th Ward (Pai Colony) remains incomplete. Following the meeting, Harish Babu spoke directly over the phone with the concerned contractors and sub-contractors, instructing them to complete the pending works on a war footing. He also directed that five newly sanctioned motors be installed within a week to improve water supply. He specifically requested the Assistant Divisional Engineer of the Electricity Department to ensure there are no power outages during water supply hours and to guarantee continuous electricity during pumping operations. Harish Babu ordered municipal officials and Water Works staff to remain vigilant and promptly resolve issues related to motors, pipelines, and electricity to ensure an uninterrupted supply of drinking water to the public. He emphasized that ensuring the residents of Dharmavaram face no difficulties regarding drinking water is the NDA government's top priority. He added that under the guidance of Minister Satya Kumar Yadav, rapid measures are being taken to resolve public grievances, and the government remains committed to providing better infrastructure for the people.

## Complaint Against Rayadurg Court Staff Submitted to District Judge

Rayadurg, July 15 (National News) A complainant on Wednesday submitted a complaint to the District Judge against Harshavardhan, a process server working at the Rayadurg Court. According to the complainant, the process server allegedly failed to serve summons in a family court case and instead admitted over a phone call that he had personally forged the recipient's signature. The complainant stated that this admission came only after the alleged forged summons had already become linked to another criminal case. The complainant said he produced the phone recording before the District Judge as evidence. The complainant further alleged that a respon-

sible court employee had abused his official position by engaging in acts such as misuse of authority, misleading the court, and cheating. Claiming that these actions had caused him mental distress and damaged his reputation, he requested the District Judge to conduct a thorough inquiry. He also urged the District Judge to investigate whether the alleged forgery was committed solely by the process server or with the involvement of others, and to take appropriate action against everyone found responsible. The complainant further alleged that, in connection with a separate dispute, the name appearing on the allegedly forged acknowledgment of the family court summons

was used to provoke a confrontation involving the respondent who was supposed to receive the summons. He questioned whether subsequent actions were intended to conceal the alleged wrongdoing by the court employee. The complainant stated that he had formally informed the District Judge about the alleged misconduct of the court employee and added that a separate complaint would also be submitted to the District Superintendent of Police (SP). > Note: This is a translation of the allegations as provided in your Telugu text. # Surprise Inspections at Anganwadis, KGBVs, and Residential Schools

Madakasira, July 15: E. Lakshmi Reddy, a member of the Andhra Pradesh State Food Commission, conducted surprise inspections on Wednesday at Anganwadi centers, Kasturba Gandhi Balika Vidyalayas (KGBVs), and residential schools across the Madakasira, Rolla, and Amarapuram mandals. He examined the quality of government-supplied rations and the nutritious food provided to students, pregnant women, and nursing mothers. As part of his tour, he visited the Chipleti-2 Anganwadi center in Madakasira, the Kallurappam Anganwadi center in Rolla mandal, the Rolla KGBV, and the Amarapuram residential school. At the Anganwadi



centers, he inspected stocks of eggs, milk, and 'Balamrutham'; he instructed workers and supervisors to ensure that nutritious food is served to pregnant women, nursing mothers, and children according to the government-prescribed menu and to improve attendance rates. He emphasized that there should be no compromise regarding food quality. At the Rolla KGBV, he inspected the kitchen and storerooms and reviewed how meals were being served to the students in accordance with the menu. Officials were instructed to pay special attention to drinking water facilities and hygiene. After inspecting the

quality of the mid-day meal at the Amarapuram Residential School, he directed the staff to use high-quality vegetables and essential commodities and to maintain cleanliness in the kitchens. Speaking on the occasion, E. Lakshmi Reddy stated that the government's objective is to provide quality, nutritious food to every eligible person in the state, particularly pregnant women, nursing mothers, and students. He warned that strict departmental action would be taken against any officials found negligent or involved in corruption regarding the distribution of food grains or the implementation of the mid-day meal scheme. Officials including DSO Vamsi Krishna Reddy, Civil Supplies DM Raju Naik, ICDS PD Pramila, MDM AD Vinay, Tahsildars, ICDS supervisors, school headmasters, wardens, and officials from the Revenue and Food Supply departments participated in these inspections.

## Preparations Underway to Revive Ramagiri Gold Mines



♦ **Minister Kollu Ravindra and MLAs Paritala Sunitha and MS Raju Inspect the Site**  
♦ **Restarting Operations Expected to Boost Employment and Government Revenue**

Ramagiri, July 15: The government has accelerated efforts to revive the historic Ramagiri gold mines in the Ramagiri Mandal of Sri Sathya Sai district. State Minister for Excise, Mines, and Geology Kollu Ravindra, Raptadu MLA Paritala Sunitha, Dharmavaram constituency in-charge Paritala Sri-ram, and Madakasira MLA MS Raju inspected the mining site on Wednesday. During the visit, they reviewed the prospects for restarting operations, mineral reserves, the volume of mine tailings, and the future course of action with officials from the Mines Department. According to



officials, Bharat Gold Mines Limited previously conducted gold and silver mining operations across an area of 168.42 hectares (416.18 acres) in Ramagiri. Although the lease was valid from 1982 to 2002, mining activities ceased in 2000. Officials explained that advancements in technology and rising gold prices in the international market have now created an opportunity to profitably extract even low-grade mineral reserves. Studies conducted by the Geological Survey of India



and Mineral Exploration and Consultancy Limited estimate that the region holds approximately 1.14 million tonnes of mineral reserves and nearly 9.1 tonnes of gold metal reserves. A preliminary survey also identified about 416,000 tonnes of mineral waste in old mine dumps, noting the potential to extract gold from this material using modern technology. Speaking on the occasion, Minister Kollu Ravindra and MLA Paritala Sunitha stated that restarting the mines through a transparent auction process—in accordance with the Central Government's MMDR Act—would not only boost government revenue through royalties, auction premiums, DMF, and NMET but also create direct and indirect employment opportunities for thousands of youths in the Ramagiri area. They expressed optimism that this initiative would provide fresh momentum to the region's socio-economic development. Officials from the Mines Department (including AD Ameer Basha and Royalty Inspector Khajavali), RDO Suvarna, revenue staff, local public representatives, and political leaders participated in the visit.

## Fuel Prices Remain Stable

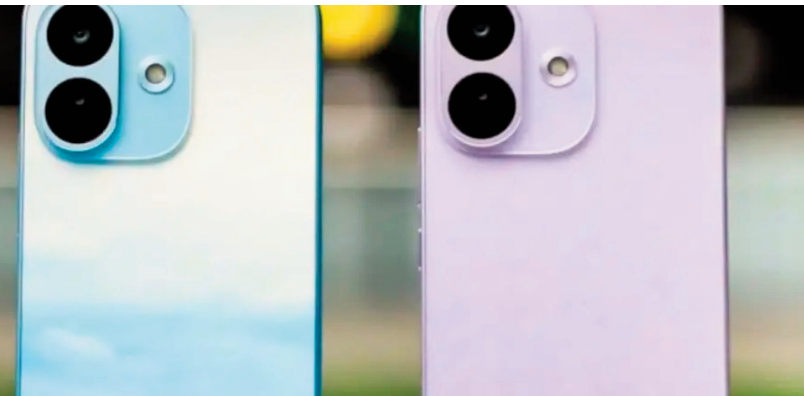


New Delhi, July 15: Petrol and diesel prices across the country remained unchanged on Wednesday. State-run oil companies have not altered fuel prices since May 25. Domestic prices have remained stable due to a slight decline in crude oil rates in the international market, offering some relief to motorists. The lack of price fluctuations allows people to plan their monthly travel expenses in advance. However, slight variations in fuel prices are observed across major cities depending on the state. In Delhi, the price of petrol is ₹102.12 per litre, and diesel is ₹95.20. In Hyderabad, petrol is being sold at ₹115.69 and diesel at ₹103.82. In Mumbai, petrol is priced at ₹111.21 and diesel at ₹97.83. In Kolkata, petrol is available at ₹113.51 and diesel at ₹99.82. In Bengaluru, petrol is ₹111.68 and diesel is ₹99.56, while in Chennai, petrol stands at ₹107.76 and diesel at ₹99.55. International crude oil prices play a crucial role in determining fuel prices. Factors such as fluctuations in the rupee-dollar exchange rate, taxes levied by central and state governments, transportation costs, and local levies also influence prices. This is why variations in fuel prices are observed across different states. Market sources indicate that developments in the global oil market, along with domestic demand and supply conditions, are likely to influence future price changes. For now, however, consumers are finding some relief as petrol and diesel prices remain stable across the country.

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## Redmi Note 17 Launched with Massive Battery

Beijing, July 15: Leading smartphone manufacturer Xiaomi has officially launched its new Redmi Note 17 smartphone in the Chinese market. Designed for consumers seeking a large screen and long battery life, the device features a 7-inch OLED display, a powerful Snapdragon processor, and an AI-based security system. The phone sports a 7-inch high-quality OLED display. With a 120Hz refresh rate, peak brightness of 1800 nits, and a high contrast ratio, videos and games appear exceptionally clear. It includes an in-display fingerprint scanner and a special feature that allows the screen to be used even while wearing gloves. The phone is available in black, light aqua, and purple. For performance, it utilizes the Snapdragon 4 Gen 4 processor, built using 4-nanometer technology. It is capable of handling both everyday use and multitasking efficiently. The phone's standout feature is its massive 8000mAh battery; the company claims it can last up to two days on a single full charge.



## 'Nijam' Changed My Film Career: Raasi



Hyderabad, July 15: In a past interview, popular actress Raasi spoke emotionally about the movie \*Nijam\*, directed by Teja, as well as a tragic event in her personal life. She stated that the film had a profound impact on her career and that the pain of losing her father during that same period remains unforgettable. Raasi revealed that

there was a stark difference between the initial details provided about her role in \*Nijam\* and the actual events that unfolded during filming. She had agreed to the project believing her character would hold significant importance in the story. She had even prepared for the role by losing weight and getting ready to appear without makeup for a natural

look. However, she recalled that on the very first day of shooting, an objectionable scene—which had not been mentioned beforehand—was being filmed; feeling it would harm her reputation and career, she decided to leave the set immediately. Raasi mentioned that she called her public relations representative at the time to explain the situation. She feared that proceeding with the film would spell the end of her acting career. However, at the request of the producers and the film crew—and realizing that all arrangements for the shoot were already in place—she reluctantly completed the scene. Raasi stated that director Teja later apologized to her during the dubbing phase, but she did not accept the apology. Although she subsequently dubbed for a few more of his films and shared a good personal rapport with him, she noted that the movie \*Nijam\* dealt a major blow to her film career. She revealed that she had almost stopped acting in films after that movie. Raasi became emotional while recalling a tragic incident from her personal life. She shared that her father had deeply wished to see her become a leading actress and took great pride in her success. She mentioned feeling anxious when her father—who would always call at midnight to wish her a happy birthday—did not call on that particular day. Shortly after her birthday celebrations concluded, she received the news of his passing. Raasi emotionally expressed that she was unable to see him one last time because she was busy with a shoot, and that pain continues to haunt her to this day.

## Gill surges in ODI rankings; closing in on the top spot



Dubai, July 15: Indian batter Shubman Gill has made significant strides in the latest ODI rankings released by the International Cricket Council (ICC). After impressing with an 80-run knock in the first ODI against England, Gill gained 12 rating points to reach the second spot on the global batters' list with a total of 803 points. New

Zealand batter Daryl Mitchell currently holds the top spot with 814 points; Gill is now just 11 points behind, edging closer to the world number one position. Indian star batters Virat Kohli and Rohit Sharma continue to hold the third and fourth positions, respectively. Indian pacer Jasprit Bumrah also improved his standing

in the bowling rankings. Returning to ODIs after a hiatus of nearly 968 days, Bumrah made an impact by taking a wicket in the first match against England, climbing to the 24th spot in the bowling rankings. Axar Patel, who was named 'Player of the Match' after claiming four wickets and scoring an unbeaten half-century in the first ODI, saw gains across all categories. He surged 18 places in the batting rankings to reach the 73rd position. He improved by two spots in the bowling rankings to reach 42nd place, while also breaking into the top ten of the all-rounders' list for the first time, securing the ninth rank. Washington Sundar, who sealed India's victory with an unbeaten half-century, also made significant strides in the rankings. He climbed 24 places to reach the 177th rank in batting and improved by 16 spots to sit at 55th in the all-rounders' list. Meanwhile, England players shone in the T20 International rankings. Harry Brook, part of the England team that swept the T20 series against India, jumped 12 places to reach the seventh rank, while Jos Buttler held the sixth spot. Pacer Jofra Archer improved by eight places to jointly secure the 18th rank.
